COUNCIL 10215

Council 10215 was chartered by the Knights of Columbus in January, 1990. Our current membership is approximately 200 men from the Church of the Incarnation parish in Centerville, St. Augustine parish in Waynesville, and the St. Leonard Faith Community in Centerville.

Our business meetings are held at 7:30 PM on the second Monday of each month in the undercroft of the church on the St. Leonard campus at 8100 Cloy Rd. We pray the rosary at 7:00 PM before each business meeting.

A member remains "in good standing" by keeping his dues paid. The initiation fee is \$15, with yearly dues of \$30 renewable in January of each year.

Council 10215's First and Second Degree Teams conduct ceremonies on a regular basis so new candidates can become active members of our Knights of Columbus council soon after the candidate has completed the necessary application form.

In 2007, Council 10215 donated just over \$12,000 to local and national charities via our fundraising activities. Our members also donated 1500 volunteer hours of service to local and national organizations.
